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Wearing The College Uniform



The Carmel College student uniform provides a distinct identity for students, setting them apart and connecting them to the history and legacy of the college community. Students are expected to contribute to this legacy by wearing their uniform with pride reflecting the conservative, professional nature of the College. High standards of dress and personal presentation are important at all times. All items of the uniform must be clean and kept in good repair. The Carmel College uniform is worn in such a manner that it reflects the values of personal dignity and respect for self, others and the College.

Sun Smart

Carmel College is committed to a culture of being sun smart. Ultraviolet radiation (UVR) levels are highest during the hours that students are at school. Students need to be aware that they are responsible for their own health and safety, be positive role models for other students and support each other to observe Sun Safe practices, which includes the wearing of suitable SPF sunscreens on exposed areas of skin and wearing a hat.

All students are expected to wear the appropriate uniform hat anytime they are not indoors.

Uniform Items

CARMEL COLLEGE FORMAL UNIFORM

- College Dress
- College Trousers and/or Shorts (option) and black leather look belt to be worn
- College Girl's navy and white pin striped shirt (option) worn tucked in
- College white and navy regulation socks
- Ribbons (if worn) to be school or house colours only
- Ink coloured stockings (no less than 80% denier)
- College Boy's navy and white pin striped shirt worn tucked in
- College trousers and/or shorts and black leather look belt to be worn
- College navy blue socks worn pulled up
- Black, polished leather lace-up shoes (Derby, Blucher or Oxford styling)
- College Tie
- College Formal hat
- College Jumper
- Blazer for Senior Years 11 & 12 (Compulsory Term 2 & 3)

- College Polo Shirt
- College Sport Shorts
- College Sport Socks
- College Bucket Hat (Years 11 & 12 transitioning out College Cap)
- Sport Shoes – jogger, cross trainer style (high-tops, canvas skate shoes, slip-on shoes are not acceptable)

- College Sports Track Pants
- House Coloured Polo Shirt
- College Jumper

Wearing the Uniform

- The Formal Uniform is worn to and from school Monday and Friday
 - Students who have practical lessons that necessitate the wearing of the Sport Uniform on these days are required to bring their sport uniform and change for the lesson
- The House Shirt is worn in place of the Sports Shirt on Tuesday. (Formal Uniform is worn if House Shirt is unavailable)
- Students may choose to wear either Formal or Sport Uniform on Wednesday and Thursday
 - Students who have practical lessons in the College Workshops or Kitchens will need to wear enclosed full leather top shoes to work in these areas
- The College track pant or sports jacket are only worn with the Sport Uniform
- The Formal Jumper may be worn with the Sport Uniform
- The correct College Hat is always worn, unless indoors
- Dresses are worn so the hem sits below the knee or mid-knee
- Sports shorts are worn so that the leg hem is longer than the fingertips with arms and fingers straight by sides
- The College Backpack is mandatory for all students to use when travelling to and from the College
- All Uniform items should be clearly marked with the student's name
- Students will be provided with direction for any variation to the uniform routine (e.g Sports Team or Arts Co-Curricular Uniform, Blazer for special occasion events) and these items are not to be worn at other times.

Personal Presentation

Hairstyles

Student hairstyles should be neat and conservative and accommodate the appropriate wearing of the College hats and uniform.

Hair which is long enough to be tied up (ponytail, plait, braid or bun) is to be secured with a band, ribbon, scrunchie or clip in school colours (Navy, Maroon, Teal, White, Gold/Yellow, Green, Blue, Red). Hair must be off the face, ears and eyebrows.

Hair is to be no shorter than a Blade 3 in any area of the style. Undercuts, tracks or distinct, sudden changes in length are not permitted.

All students' hair must be a natural and conservative single colour at all times.

Excessiveness in style, colour, gel, or cut, which the College deems as extreme, will not be tolerated. Extreme styles are not acceptable and what is considered extreme is at the discretion of the Senior Leadership Team. Examples (of extreme) include but are not limited to: mullets; horsetails; mohawks; punk styles, undercuts; dramatic multi-tone hair, tracks, rats tails, crew cuts shorter than blade 3, dreadlocks. Cornrows or braids are permitted when they run uniformly from the front to the back of the head only.

All students are to be clean shaven.

Jewellery

Permitted items of jewellery are:-

- A watch (smart watches must be used in accordance with the Personal Digital Device Procedure)
- A plain necklace with appropriate religious symbol (appropriate icons are those easily identified as aligning with the values of the College)
- One pair (one in each ear) of earrings (no bigger than 15mm) worn in the lower earlobe
- Necklaces or bracelets identifying emergency medical information may be worn.

Observable facial or body piercing is banned. Students are not permitted to cover any piercings with band aids nor are plugs, clears, spacers or retainers acceptable.

Makeup

Permitted makeup includes:

- Clear Nail polish
- Light natural toned facial makeup

Fake nails, eye/eyebrow liner, mascara, fake eyelashes, eyelash extensions and coloured lipstick/gloss/liners are not part of the school uniform and must not be worn.

Personal Presentation

Tattoos

It should be noted that tattoos are illegal for anyone under the age of 18 in Queensland. Tattoos are not to be visible at any time.

Incorrect Uniform

Students who present in incorrect uniform will be managed via Student Behaviour Support processes.

Special Consideration

As an inclusive community, Carmel College recognises that on occasion young people may require support in various ways, including the wearing of the uniform. If you believe there is a special circumstance in relation to the wearing of the uniform, we invite you to contact us to discuss a plan.

Athlete Development Program

Students involved in the Athlete Development Program are supplied with the ADP shirt and may wear this for their practical ADP lessons. This should be accompanied with their Sport shorts and Sport socks. The ADP shirt is not worn to and from school.



Team Sports Uniform

Students who play for the College in representative teams will be required to wear the Team Playing shorts available from the Uniform Shop. Students participating in team sports will be loaned a Team jersey for the competition. However, for some sports students will be required to purchase jerseys for frequent use. Football socks are required for AFL, Rugby League, Rugby Union and Soccer.

Uniform Shop

During Term time, the Uniform Store is open **Tuesday 7.30am-3.00pm; Wednesday 7.30am-2.00pm and Thursday 7.30am-2.00pm.**

To access the Uniform Store, the store is located on the Ground Floor of the Shalom building beside our IT Department.

Please note that Carmel College Uniform Store stocks all uniform items except for shoes. Senior students may also be required to order Blazers if the Uniform Store does not have the appropriate size in stock or if alterations are required. Orders and alterations can take up to six weeks to arrive.

- The operating hours are Tuesday-Thursday by appointment for new students.
- Opening days are also published in the school calendar and new parents are advised by the Enrolments Secretary.
- Carmel College has a relationship with the Sustainable School Shop to provide a convenient way for the College community to buy and sell second-hand uniform items.
